

1.1 Information behind the links

There are many links in this booklet, to access the content behind the links, **click directly from the page** to open the link in your browser. Copy/pasting the link into the browser <u>will not work</u> as many links have been shortened to fit into these travel suggestions.

1.2 More about the travel suggestions

In the next pages are different travel suggestions to different areas of Finland and Sweden. You are welcome to use any of these suggestions to make your travels, however we would like to remind you of key points:

- 1. our organization committee cannot make any reservation on your behalf, nor are we able to modify any reservations you will make.
- 2. the average prices mentioned hereafter are subject to change; *always* check directly from the company's website for the updated prices.
- 3. the currency in many countries in Europe, including Finland, is the Euro, you can convert to your own currency easily online. However, in Nordic countries this may vary, e.g., if you travel to Sweden the currency is Swedish Krona, in Norway Norwegian Krone, in Denmark Danish Krone.
- 4. Checking the opening hours and possible summer holidays of the places you want to visit is highly recommended as there may be restricted opening times even during the peak touristic season.
- 5. When possible, we highly recommend making the reservation using the official company website rather than relying on the intermediary pages, because it is quite difficult in Finland to make modifications to tickets if they are booked via external providers. However, external provider's will be very handy to explore options and reviews of the service you intend to book.

1.3 Hotel suggestions

To book your hotel in any of the cities that the suggestions will bring you to, we recommend that you check the booking.com website. This platform is often used in Europe, and you are able to check the hotels' availabilities, depending on your preferences (stars, prices, dates, options, etc.). Afterwards, you are able to make the reservations either via booking.com or on the hotel's own website. The general link is: https://www.booking.com/

2 Adventuring the capital city: Helsinki

Helsinki is the capital of Finland since 1812, and definitely a place worthy to visit when being in Finland. The recommended length of your stay in the capital city depends on the scope of your interest. This can be a weekend or a week trip given the objects you hope to visit. On this page you will find information and links to travel from Vaasa to Helsinki as easily as possible.

2.1 Travelling from Vaasa to Helsinki

To get to Helsinki, it is recommended to use either the bus, the train, or the plane; choosing the best one for you depend on your time availabilities and budget.

- **Getting there by bus** takes between 7 and 8 hours, and there are mainly two providers that will bring you there:

To get the travel details, change the dates and times to yours, and the prices will update automatically. To give you an idea, the price of the ticket average between $15 \in$ and $40 \in$, the earlier you purchase the ticket, the cheaper it will be.

- **Getting there by train** takes about 4 hours and there is only one provider in Finland: VR, link: <u>https://www.vr.fi/en</u>. The company operates on dynamic pricing, so the earlier you buy the tickets, the cheaper the price will be; the prices can be found as low as 25€ one-way.

To get the travel details, on the home page, in the section "From" write Vaasa, in the section "To" write Helsinki. It will them prompt you to enter your departure/return date and other information. <u>IMPORTANT!</u> <u>Do not mark your passenger type as "student"</u>; **even if** you are a student in your country. In Finland, student prices are only reserved for students in Finnish Universities, so you cannot benefit from the student prices online in Finland.

Getting there by plane takes about 1 hour (excluding getting to airport, checking in and passing security) and the easiest provider to use is the national airline: Finnair, link: <u>https://www.finnair.com/fi-en</u>. The prices average 140€ one-way.

2.2 Activities recommendations in Helsinki

Whether you want to get to know more about Arts, Architecture, History, Cultural traits, or Traditions, Helsinki has something for you to see and do. 3 Exploring the West-coast: Vaasa-Tampere-Turku

Travelling to different cities on a circuit is a very easy trip in Finland to do by train, and it allows you to visit different part of the country. This West-Coast exploration circuit is shared in two sections, the first part is Vaasa-Tampere, and the second part is Tampere-Turku.

3.1 Circuit 1: Vaasa-Tampere

3.1.1 Travelling from Vaasa to Tampere

In Finland, there is only one train line: VR, link: <u>https://www.vr.fi/en</u>. To travel from Vaasa to Tampere is very easy; on the home page, in the section "From" write Vaasa, in the section "To" write Tampere. It will them prompt you to enter your departure/return date and other information. The prices will automatically update when you click "search journeys". As the company operates on dynamic pricing, the earlier you buy the tickets, the cheaper the price will be; the prices can be found as low as 16€ one-way.

<u>IMPORTANT!</u> Do not mark your passenger type as "student"; **even if** you are a student in your country. In Finland, student prices are only reserved for students in Finnish Universities, so you cannot benefit from the student prices online in Finland.

3.1.2 Activities recommendation in Tampere

Tampere is known to be the most loved city in Finland. With numerous events, activities for all, fascinating cultural experiences, lakes and urban views at every corner, the city will welcome you into a gorgeous landscape. 3.2 Circuit 2: Tampere-Turku

3.2.1 Travelling from Tampere to Turku

In Finland, there is only one train line: VR, link: <u>https://www.vr.fi/en</u>. To travel from Tampere to Turku is very easy; on the home page, in the section "From" write Tampere, in the section "To" write Turku and choose the option: Turku (City Centre, Logomo) – *this is the station in the city-centre and the main train station in the city of Turku*. It will them prompt you to enter your departure/return date and other information. The prices will automatically update when you click "search journeys". As the company operates on dynamic pricing, the earlier you buy the tickets, the cheaper the price will be; the prices can be found as low as 10€ one-way.

<u>IMPORTANT!</u> <u>Do not mark your passenger type as "student"</u>; **even if** you are a student in your country. In Finland, student prices are only reserved for students in Finnish Universities, so you cannot benefit from the student prices online in Finland.

3.2.2 Activities recommendations in Turku

Turku is the oldest city in Finland and used to be the capital city of the country until 1812 (year when it changed to Helsinki). The city is a gateway to Finnish archipelago and has plenty to keep you occupied both on land and at sea. Make sure to check the website to get the full list of what you can see and do in Turku during your stay: <u>https://en.visitturku.fi/see-and-do</u>. But here are a few ideas already:

- Moomin World > a theme park based on the Finnish-Swedish artist who created the Moomin characters.

4 Escaping further North: trip to Lapland

Lapland is a region in Northern Finland, but also in Sweden and Norway. This section will highlight mainly the Finnish Lapland, but you are welcome to make your own research on Swedish Lapland and Norwegian Lapland.

4.1 Travelling to Lapland

From Vaasa, the easiest Lappish places to reach are the city of Rovaniemi and the area of Kittilä, and you can get there either by train, or by plane. However, you may be interested in flying to another one of the six airport in Lapland, just make sure you can get there from Vaasa (or the city you are departing from).

Getting to Rovaniemi by train takes between 6h30 - 8 hours, the time difference depends on the type of train and number of stops/changes on the road. There is only one provider in Finland: VR, link: https://www.vr.fi/en. The company operates on dynamic pricing, so the earlier you buy the tickets, the cheaper the price will be; the prices can be found as low as 19€ one-way. (Rovaniemi is the only city that is reachable in the summer)

<u>IMPORTANT!</u> Do not mark your passenger type as "student"; **even if** you are a student in your country. In Finland, student prices are only reserved for students in Finnish Universities, so you cannot benefit from the student prices online in Finland.

 Getting to Rovanimi and Kittilä by plane takes about 3 hours to Rovaniemi and 4h30 to Kittilä (excluding getting to airport, checking in and passing security) and it is made easy with Finnair, the Finnish national airline: <u>https://www.finnair.com/fi-en</u>. Prices average 125€ one-way for both destinations.

4.2 Getting around in Lapland

Lapland is a large area, getting to one city is the easiest solution to reach Lapland, and you are then invited to get around using the public transportation or your own mode of transportation. On the LaplandNorth website: <u>https://laplandnorth.fi/en/about-the-area/travel-information/</u> can be found a lot of information about: airport shuttle, or public transportation.

4.3 Staying in Lapland

Because Lapland is a large area and unique lodging are possible there, booking.com (as mentioned in the informational notice on page 2) might not present you with all of the possibilities. Travelling to Stockholm can be done by taking a flight from Vaasa. Getting there by plane takes about 2h30 (excluding getting to airport, checking in and passing security). The national Finnish airline Finnair will take you to Stockholm often with a single stop in Helsinki for a price that average the 195€ round-trip.
